Entrance Examination Guidelines

Bachelor of Arts Bachelor of Legislative Law (BALLB) Program

Introduction:

Admission into the BALLB program will be based on merit. Gandaki University will conduct a BALLB Admission Test, a National Level Entrance Examination for admission to the Bachelor of Arts Bachelor of Law (BALLB) program offered by the university.

Applicants must secure at least 40 marks to be considered in the selection pool.

Test Structure:

There are 100 test items. Each question is provided with four answer options, of which only one option is correct, while the rest of the options are distractors. The questions will be based on the Secondary Education Examination (SEE) and School Leaving Certificate (SLC) Grade XII or equivalent level courses.

The test covers four sections. The details of the test are as follows:

Law:

The general concept of Jurisprudence and law, the purpose of the law, classification, types of law and sources of law, Law and Society: Importance and role of law in society, Concept of Human rights and its principles, Major International human right instruments, Constitution and organs of the state, Basic idea and scope of the legal profession, Fundamental rights and duties under the Constitution of Nepal 2072 B.S, Concept of Property, Rights and duties, Person and personality, Concept of Justice, Morality, and Law, Nepali legal system and its evolution.

General English:

Vocabulary, Spelling Mistakes, Synonyms and Antonyms, Rearrangement of words in sentences, English comprehension, Para Jumbles, Fill in the blanks, Articles, English Usage errors, Idioms and Phrases, Cloze Test, One-word substitution, Spotting errors, Analogies, Inappropriate usage of words.

Social Studies:

Concept of society; Types of society; Fundamental elements of society; Notion of Culture; Concept of development; Infrastructures for development; Indigenous knowledge, skills, and technologies; Nepalese traditions, Social Values, and Norms; Social problems and solutions; Civic consciousness; Election; Geography of Nepal; Major historical events in Nepal and the world; International Relations, peace, and cooperation.

Analytical and Logical Reasoning:

Number Test, Relationship Test, Analogy Test, Alpha Numeric Symbol Sequence, Insert Missing Sequence Test, Direction and Distance Test, Classification (Odd Man Out) Test, Time Sequence Test, Logical Word Sequence Test, Statement Arguments, Mathematical Operations, Series Test, Logic Test, Data Arrangement Test, Statements Assumptions, Ranking Test.

General Knowledge:

Science, Sports, Current Affairs (geographical, social, cultural, religious, environmental, political, state affairs, legal, judicial, national, and international contemporary issues (Gandaki University affairs), Awards, Technology and Internet, General Polity, Economic studies.

Merit list and admission criteria:

Admissions will be strictly based on the merit list. The merit list will be formulated based on the entrance exam score (90%) and CGPA obtained in SEE (5%) and SLC (Grade XII) (5%).
